


Ukraine: economic situation

Current situation

- Ca. 20% of Ukraine's territory is occupied
- Appr. 6.5 m Ukrainians left the country and ca. 8 m people are internally displaced
- Infrastructure damage is currently estimated at USD 104 bn (>50% of GDP in 2021)
- Key export routes / seaports blocked
- Main affected sectors: agriculture, energy, transport and industry

Economic implications of the war

- Real GDP to decline by ca. 30% in 2022, according to GET estimations
- Monetary policy: strong administrative measures to support exchange rate
- Fiscal policy: huge funding gap, USD 5 bn per month; need for external support

➤ **Huge economic impact of war, outlook very uncertain**

Ukraine: areas for institutional cooperation

Agriculture

- Developing export routes to secure sales of grain
- Better access to EU market

Energy sector

- ENTSO-E electricity market integration
- Higher energy security via diversification of energy supplies
- “Green recovery” aspects in the context of the reconstruction process

Transport


- Reconstruction of modern transport system
- Stronger integration into EU transport network

Industry

- Green reconstruction of export-oriented mining and metallurgy sectors


Moldova: economic situation

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Effect of war in UKR and sanctions against RUS

- Strong impact on agrofood exports to RUS
- Lower remittances from RUS
- Fiscal burden due to refugees from UKR
- But: main effect relates to gas/oil prices

Energy sector

- Huge exposure to gas for electricity/heating
- Gas is imported almost exclusively from RUS
- In the past: relatively cheap gas from RUS and cheap electricity from TN
- But: “cheap is often expensive”

Macroeconomic implications for 2022

- Practically no economic growth
- Very high inflation of over 25% yoy
- Public finance under pressure

➤ **Stagflation, fiscal pressure and social tension due to inflation and high energy prices**

Moldova: areas for institutional cooperation

Main field for cooperation: energy

- Energy efficiency in residential and public buildings
- Establishment of energy efficiency fund
- Appropriate framework and attraction of investment into renewables
- ENTSO-E market integration
- Planning and implementation of climate goals in energy sector

Trade and logistics


- Deeper integration with EU
- Strengthening of logistics in view of loss of access to Odesa port

Migration

- Measures to deal with UKR refugees
- Making the most of potential returning migrants from RUS (labour market integration)


Georgia: economic situation

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Effect of war in UKR and sanctions against RUS

- Little effect on exports to RUS
- Somewhat lower remittances from RUS
- Effect on tourism (key sector in GEO):
 - Less traditional RUS tourists possible
 - But: huge influx of “remote workers” from RUS and BLR (IT, etc.); >40k since start of war
 - Net effect: likely positive

Energy sector

- Gas imports from AZE not affected
- Higher prices for oil imports
- Electricity: imports from RUS; exposure

Macroeconomic implications for 2022

- Practically no effect on economic growth
- Moderate effect on inflation
- Public finance not affected

➤ **Good economic situation in GEO**

Georgia: areas for institutional cooperation

Energy

- Reduction of exposure due to electricity imports from RUS
- Appropriate framework and attraction of investment into renewables, mainly hydro power

Trade and logistics


- Opportunities for establishing GEO as a transit route, given that the Northern route is not feasible in the medium term
- Certification to ease transport to the EU

Migration

- Measures to deal with the influx of high-skilled persons from RUS and BLR



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Effect of war in UKR and sanctions against RUS

- Significant effect on exports of brandy and agri-food products to RUS
- Sizeable reduction of remittances from RUS
- Effect on tourism:
 - Less traditional RUS tourists feasible
 - But: huge influx of “remote workers” from RUS and BLR (IT, etc.); WB estimates > 40,000
 - Net effect: likely positive

Energy sector

- Gas imports from RUS not affected
- Only moderate increase in oil prices from RUS

Macroeconomic implications for 2022

- Sizeable effect on economic growth
- But: little effect on inflation
- Fiscal: possible shock in case of strong migration of (ethnic) Armenians from RUS

➤ **Sizeable negative effect on ARM**

Armenia: areas for institutional cooperation

Energy

- Huge exposure to RUS calls for diversification of generation and imports
- Appropriate framework and attraction of investment into renewables

Trade and logistics

- Normalisation of trade with TUR
- Investment into logistics for trade with TUR and transit

Migration

- Measures to deal with the influx of high-skilled persons from RUS and BLR
- Preparation for possible sizeable migration of (ethnic) Armenians from RUS in the second half of the year

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TAIEX in brief



- TAIEX – **Technical Assistance and Information Exchange** – offers peer-to-peer technical assistance and policy support from public experts in EU Member States to beneficiaries in the enlargement and neighbourhood regions.
- TAIEX assistance is **also available to countries covered by development policies and the Partnership Instrument worldwide**, as well as to the **EU Member States** to support structural reforms and regional and environment policies.
- The instrument **targets** primarily **public administrations**, but also judiciary and law enforcement authorities, parliamentary administrations, representatives of social partners, trade unions and employers' associations.
- TAIEX is **funded from the EU budget** and managed by DG Neighbourhood and Enlargement Negotiations in the European Commission.

TAIEX in 2021



- Expertise mobilised **2,200+** times
- **Over 14,300** participants
- **57%** more attendees and **54%** more experts (compared to 2020)
- **92%** of participants rated TAIEX experts as **excellent or good** (data for 2020)








Online, in-person or hybrid



- Of 199 TAIEX events taking place in January-April 2022, 62 were either hybrid or fully in-person,
- For example, on 23-25 March in Tunis, some **150 participants from Algeria, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia** learned about best EU practices to counter vector-borne emerging diseases with the aim of preserving veterinary public health.

- For the reporting period 2015-2020, 86% of beneficiaries and **89% of experts agreed that TAIEX events strengthened their professional network with public officials from other countries.**
- Although primarily intended as an instrument for strengthening the capacities of beneficiaries, TAIEX has also strengthened the knowledge and skills of public officials participating as experts. In the surveys done for this 2015-2020 evaluation, **95% of experts agreed that the events had contributed to their personal and professional development and that they learned a lot from the beneficiaries.**
- The share of female experts mobilised by TAIEX rose from 34% in 2016 to 44% in 2020.
- **Over 90% of respondents perceived the administrative burden of TAIEX as low in comparison to the results reached.**
- Surveyed stakeholders overwhelmingly agreed that TAIEX events strengthened participants' **perception of the EU as a valuable partner** (88% of experts and 86% of participants; 9% of experts and 10% of participants did not provide an opinion).









Reduction of administrative burden

- Performance Based Financing (Study on application of PBF to Twinning is in progress)
- Simplification of rules (e.g. reduction of duplicated messages, removal of non essential templates and eventual reduction of rules without removing the essence of Twinning).

Harmonisation of rules

- Checklists (already in place in EUDs and Contracting Authorities)
- Training to EUDs, Contracting Authorities (in progress)


Intermediate update of Manual

- “Quick wins”
 - Things are stated only once in the Manual + annexes
 - Increase of ceiling for the purchase of goods (e.g. from 5,000 to 20,000)
 - Removal of maximum 4 assignments for RTAs
- Digital Flexibility (e.g. hybrid missions, hybrid steering committees, hybrid selection meetings).
- Lessons learned from INTPA pilots (e.g. more clarity on the rule of calculation of per diems, possibility of “business” class for long haul flights)



- Ausblick auf Veranstaltungsangebot des NCP 2. Jahreshälfte: Twinning-Seminare, Möglichkeit für Informationsveranstaltungen Bundesländer, etc.

European Public Sector Expertise

Relevanz:



- Beschluss für unsere Aufgabenerfüllung **von strategischer Bedeutung**. Internationale Kooperationen der Ressorts bekommen durch die Ratschlussfolgerungen pol. Unterstützung.
- Durch aktive Beteiligung an Twinning/ TAIEX (bzw. PSE) **können deutsche Verwaltungen der europäischen Forderung nachkommen** und aktiven Beitrag zur Nachbarschafts- und Beitrittspolitik leisten.
- Twinning Koordinator:innen können dazu beitragen, dass **PSE Modalitäten in der internationalen Zusammenarbeit der Ressorts/Länder mitgedacht werden**.
- Der Einsatz von PSE Modalitäten als komplementäre Komponente wird in EU finanzierten Projekten immer wichtiger.




